DENVER (November 4, 2015) – The Colorado Cross-Disability Coalition (CDCC), the premiere organization in Colorado for advocating for disability rights, honored Claudine McDonald at this year's Access Awards luncheon held on November 3.

Colorado Access is a nonprofit health plan that provides access to behavioral and physical health services for Coloradans. McDonald has worked for Colorado Access for over 18 years and is the director of the Office of Member & Family Affairs. In her role she works closely with the Medicaid population and serves as an internal ombudsman on member concerns helping families to navigate the system and find solutions complex needs.

In addition to the CCDC Access award, McDonald has received two Governor of Colorado appointments. One for the Governor's Asian Pacific American Advisory Council where she promoted diversity and competency to increase quality of services. The second when she was appointed to the Senate Bill 211 Advisory Commission to Cover All Colorado Kids to promote healthcare coverage for all Colorado children.
